COME ALL YE FAIR AND TENDER MARENS (1974) 3:10. American version of an English song. Fish had heard it often along this at the Green House.

A GOOD MAN IS HARD TO FIND (1974) 3:10. What is this song on a folk record? I don't know, except that we sing everything at home.

WHEN MORNING BREAKS (1974) 3:10. Brinda arrived for the gentle company. Fish gave a number of his songs.

CHICKENS (1974) 3:10. Brinda wrote this during her stay in 1974. Fish is responsible for the lyrics. Brinda is responsible for the music. Fish's feeling of a tale about a certain chicken is unusual.

I'M THUNDER (1974) 3:10. I found this written in a book. "The Story of the John Piper's"—the first name given from New Orleans. Brinda, Mrs. Brinda, a former slave had heard her father singing this song when she was a child. After he had been released, he would sit down a porch by her father and with his hands clasped, down his cheeks he would sing with an such passion that even the members were moved.
