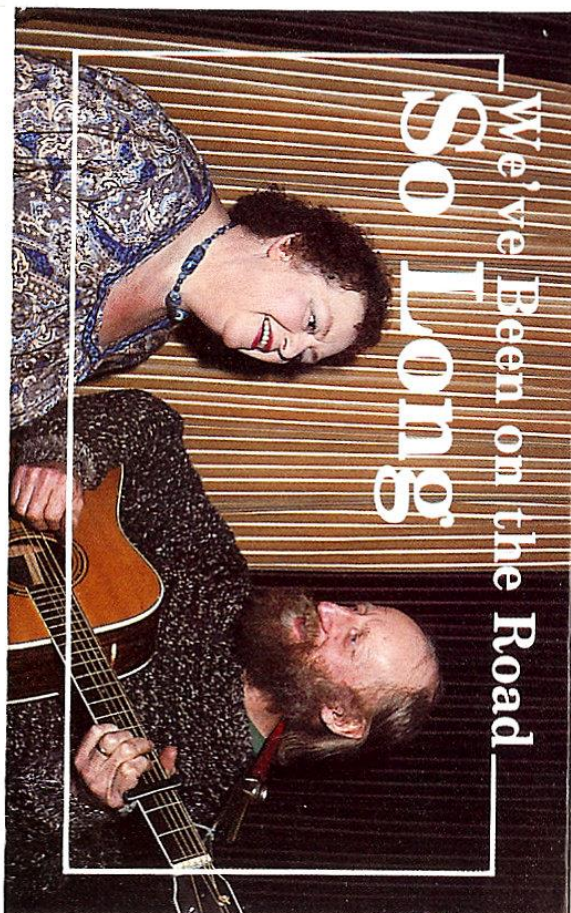

. . . . met at the Count House Folk Music Club, Botallack, near Land's End in 1964. When it closed in 1966, the Pipers Folk Club took its place. Brenda and John continued as resident singers there until 1974 when Brenda turned professional and went 'on the road'.

In 1983, John and his wife Carrie sadly lost their son Merrick John at the age of 4 months in a 'Cot Death'. Happily, little Hannah has since arrived to join big sister Tabitha, and both were present at the Penventon Hotel for this memorable reunion concert to raise funds for the Foundation for the Study of Infant Deaths.
